As a principal, sometimes I deal with hard stuff- staffing concerns, accidents, trauma, budget, etc. But ALWAYS I get to spend time with great kids who love to share about their successes, wishes and even disappointments. This brings me great joy- connecting with the kids and supporting them as they figure out their world from wherever they are at is a gift in my life.

Kids tell great stories. The most minor event in life can be so exciting to them. And listening to them share about these helps me build a relationship with them. Sometimes we have to spend time in my office processing thru a difficult situation or challenge. Other times, we meet together to share and celebrate growth. Either way, it gives me a chance to get to know them better as we learn to trust and respect one another.

With all this conversation going on at school, you can imagine my shock when I recently read a study where listening devices were placed in homes and cars of families to track the amount of focused conversation parents are having with their kids. This is focused conversation without the distraction of friends, cell phones, video games or television- just face to face talking. How much time would you say you spend in daily conversation with each of your children? I was shocked by the results that indicated today, the average parent is spending...3 MINUTES per day in focused conversation with their child. It takes me longer than that to brush my teeth!

When I heard that statistic, I immediately started paying attention to my conversations at home with my own kids. I leave my phone in my bedroom when my kids are home after school so it's no longer a distraction, I ask my kids to have their phones put away when we are visiting and I try to just enjoy the moment. I definitely have felt a better connection and presence with my kids. My kids are opening up more about challenges and concerns they have with friends and school. We are laughing more often together about the funny things that happen in our day. We are present and connected.

So I challenge you as parents- unplug and talk this month! See what a difference it can make in your home.
